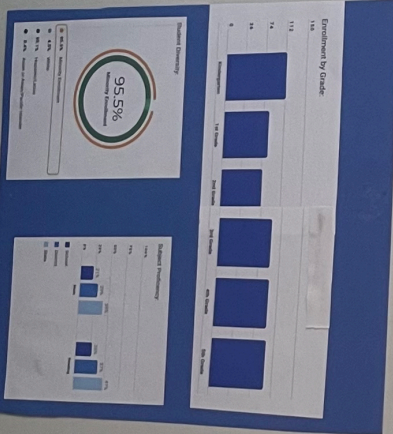
Purpose
