


Robert Toynton, "Invisible Other"

- Queer identity: invisible and marginalized
- Academic disruption
- Emotional burden

Invisible Identity

"While everyone who interacts is involved in some level of emotional work, the queer, through being both other and invisible, is subjected to a burden of emotional work of a different order of magnitude to that of the privileged majority." **(Toynton 2006)**




Writing Center Work


