



COLONIALISM, THE BROAD STROKES

- How is colonialism perpetuated?
 - Othering and Selfing: 'us' and 'them' dynamic.
 - Frames the other as lower than the self
 - Imperial ideaology δ
 preconceptions perpetuated
 by tradition.
 - Academic
 - Artistic
 - etc...



COLONIZATION, IN MY SCI-FI?!

- Recontextualization / projection of colonial narratives and history within SF
- Three main narratives according to Greg Gerwell
 - Explorative: Initial contact, suffering
 of the explorer
 - Domesticating: Establishing home on the frontier
 - Combative: colonize or be colonized/make the unfamilar familiar.

THE NARRATOR

BEGINS REMOVED FROM IMPERIALISM / UNSUBJECTED



ENTRY 1: IS A SUBALTERN, SUBJUGATED BUT ABSENT FROM TEXT



ENTRY 2: BECOMES AN OTHER, SUBJUGATED BUT PRESENT IN TEXT



ENTRY 16: BECOMES A SELF, DIRECTLY INTERACTS WITH THE TEXT AND SELF


WHY AN EPISTOLARY NARRATIUE?

- Enables unreliable narration
 - Historical narratives tend to be unreliable
- creates juxtaposition between two diverging narratives and worldviews




TEXTUAL INTERACTION

- The narrator breaks free of othering through interaction with text, but must become a self
 - Inspired by Spivak's assertions
 - Some power over their ability to appear in text, but only when they are a self
 - Narrator's fracturing of text
 breaks traditional narrative flow



DECONSTRUCTING THE SUBLIME

- To experience the sublime is to experience something which inspires awe and horror simultaneously
 - The Narrators sublime quality as a unique characteristic/ controlling the uncontrolable
 - Loss of the sublime quality indicative of being subsumed into the self?



IMPERIAL DETERMINATION AND KNOWLEDGE

- In Orientalism, European knowledge of Asia and North Africa is used as justification for colonization
 - Europe: Must dominate for the good of the world
 - The Orient: Must be dominated for their own good
- In 'The Distant Star's Shadow', knowledge is also used a tool of opression
 - Humans: Will use the world for more important ends
 - The Entity: Is dangerous / will limit human progress
- BOTH ARE FOUNDED ON A PREXISTING TRADITION REMOVED FROM THE COLONIZED.

COGNITIUE DISSONANCE & COLONIALISM

- Main concept: Cognitive Dissonance
 - There must be consistency between our attitudes and behaviors
 - Otherwise we experience <u>cognitive disoonance</u>
- Cognitive dissonance and colonialism
 - Cognitive dissonance resolved by placing the self above the other
 - Resolution results in perpetuation and reinforcement of colonial world view
